

Christina López is a Chicana feminist who grew up in the projects in Phoenix, Arizona. Her working-class family has roots in the Southwest that predate U.S. borders.

López became the Organizer of Seattle Radical Women in 2005, where she helped lead the chapter in defense of immigrant rights, union campaigns, and reproductive justice, and in opposition to police brutality, U.S. wars, and budget cuts targeting the most vulnerable. López also

serves on the National Steering Committee of Radical Women. In 2012, she became the U.S. vice-presidential candidate on the slate of the Freedom Socialist Party, Radical Women's sister organization. With running-mate Stephen Durham, López challenges the system's "unjust economic system and the rigged electoral process that keeps it in place."
